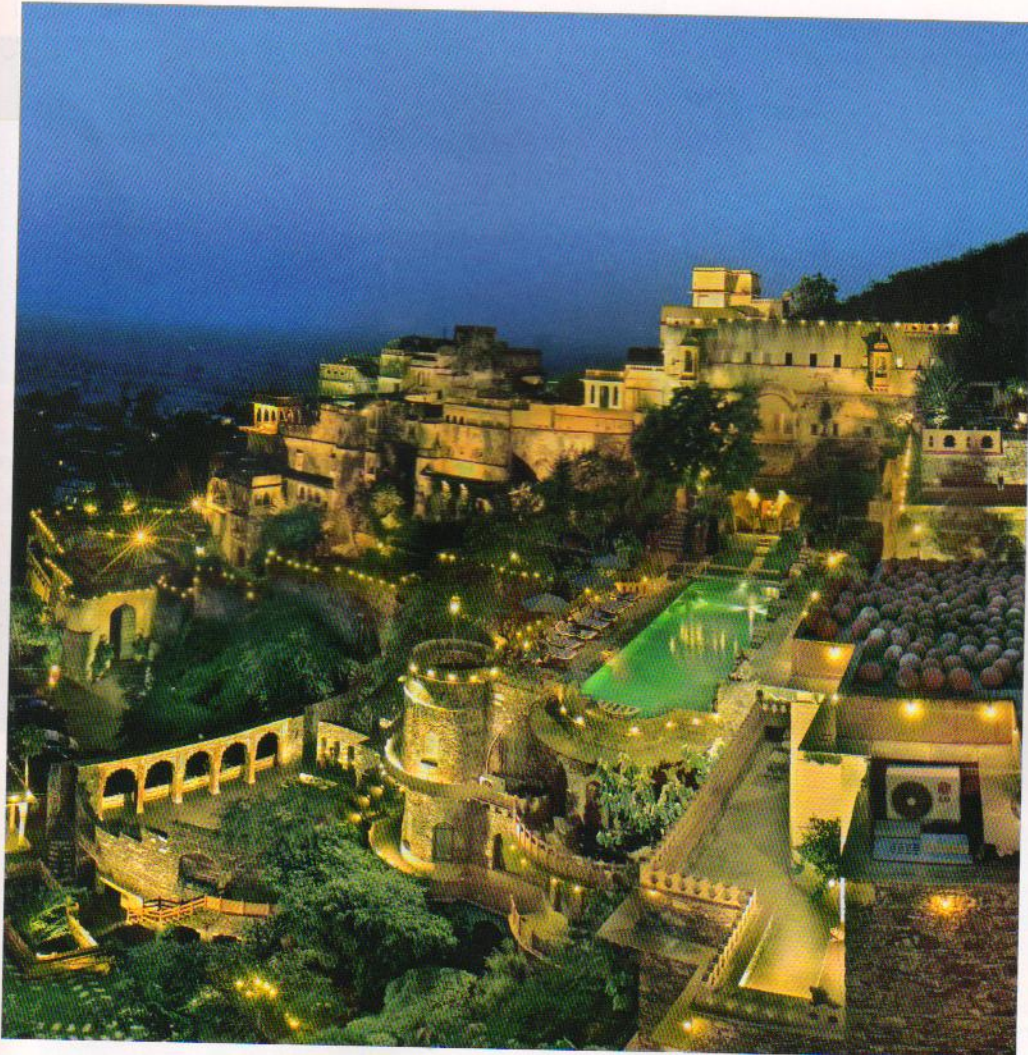


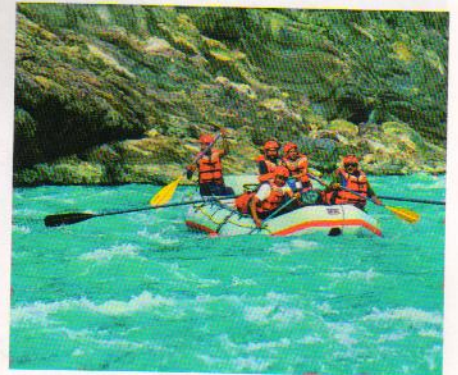

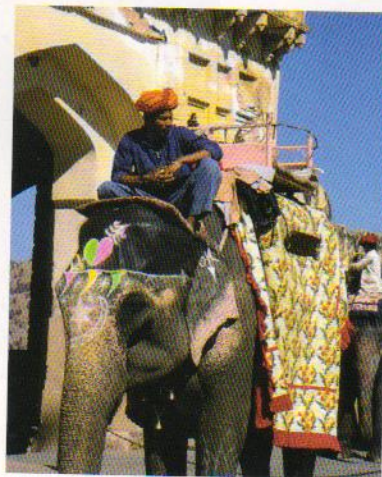
Safari
